College History

Ravulapalem is the entry point for the lushy green Konaseema Delta region, often called the Kerala of Andhra. Ravulapalem is well known for its Banana Market, diverse cuisine, hospitality of its people & numerous trucking services that caters to PAN India. Although it is a tiny town on the banks of the powerful Godavari and along the Chennai–Kolkata National Highway, its heart and mind are primarily rural in nature because agriculture is its main economic sector. Established in 1981(31-08-1981), the college is a government institution situated on a five-acre plot of land bordered by NH on one side and coconut and banana orchards on three sides. The college's motto is "Vidyadhanam Sarvadhana Pradhanam", and it intends to strengthen its competitive edge by providing high-quality education as knowledge is the most important wealth among all. The beautiful serene environment amidst the vast green fields is the advantage of our college. According to provisions 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956, it is affiliated with Adikavi Nannaya University, Rajamahendravaram and recognised by the UGC. 495 students are pursuing their study in the academic year 2022–2023 (current year), and 22 members of the teaching staff are guiding them. The college provides traditional degrees such B.A. (HEP), B. Com (Gen), B. Sc (MPCS, IOT, MPC, BZC, HBC) and B.Com (Computer Applications). The college's energetic and dedicated instructors give their all to the student body while using effective teaching techniques. The Jawahar Knowledge Center, the Center for Capacity Building, the Digital Classrooms, and the Virtual Classrooms are all available to the college. The majority of the college's students are from the nearby villages, which are dispersed over an area of up to ten kilometres. Most of the students come from economically and socially disadvantaged areas of society and unprepared for college study. These are the difficulties the college must overcome in order to provide the students who need it most with a high-quality education. Yet, the college makes constant and significant efforts to fulfil its vision, mission, and objectives by fervently pursuing novel and student-centered extracurricular, cocurricular, and curricular activities. And the college is accredited with the **‘B+’ Grade with a CGPA score of 2.67** in the third cycle of academic evaluation by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) on 27-09-2023.

Estimating the Value of Pi

The value of Pi (π) is defined as the ratio of the circumference of a circle to its diameter and equal to 3.14159 approximately. In a circle, if we divide the circumference (the total distance around the circle) by the diameter, you get the same number. Whether the circle is large or small, the value of pi remains the same. The symbol for Pi is denoted π and pronounced "pie." It is the 16 letters of the Greek alphabet and is used to represent a mathematical constant.

Pi Values in Fractions and Decimal

Pi (π) is mainly expressed in two different ways, which are:

Value of pi(π) in fraction

Value of Pi (π) in Fractions

How to Calculate Value of Pi?

To calculate the value of π , the pi formula is used:

$$\pi = (\text{Circumference} / \text{Diameter})$$

$$\text{Or, } \pi = 3.14159 = 22/7$$

GI tag gives the right to only those registered users the right to use the product name, and prevents others from using the product name that does not meet the standards prescribed.

GI tags are used on the following types of products.

1. Handicrafts – Examples would be Madhubani Paintings, Mysore Silk
2. Food items – Example would be Tirupati Laddu, Rasgulla.
3. Wine & Drinks – Example would be Champagne, Cognac of France; Scotch Whisky of UK, Tequila of Mexico.
4. Industrial Products
5. Agricultural Products – Basmati Rice
